INTRODUCTION

Voice, a key discipline of the Geneva International Music Competition, features every two years. Now permanently inscribed in Geneva's heritage, the Voice competition has seen a long succession of many of the important names that have marked the post-war world of art, such as Eva Stalder, José van Dam, Victoria De Los Angeles, Teresa Stick-Randall, Michelle Crider and Annette Dasch. Geneva is one of the most significant steps in the lyrical world.

The Geneva Voice Competition is distinct from other vocal competitions because it is wide-ranging and not specifically dedicated to opera. In addition to oratorio arias, entrants must sing Lieder or French mélodies from different eras. In the same way, in the Final they are asked to sing an opera aria, a Lied with orchestra and a piece of their own choice: opera, operetta or oratorio. This means that winners of the Geneva International Music Competition are singers whose skills are well-rounded and who have a broad musical culture.

ENTRY CONDITIONS

The 71st Geneva International Music Competition is open to all singers aged 32 and below, regardless of gender or nationality. There are no exceptions.

Candidates who have previously won a First Prize in the Geneva International Music Competition are not permitted to enter in the same discipline.

PROGRAMME

PRESELECTION

The 38 participants have been selected on the basis of a video recording comprising three pieces: an aria by Vivaldi, Mozart, Handel, Gluck or Haydn, and an opera aria and a mélodie or Lied of their own choice.

RECITAL I (40 candidates max. – 15 min.)

- 1 aria by Vivaldi, Handel, Mozart, Gluck or Haydn
- 1 opera aria of own choice
- 1 oratorio aria or a Lied/mélodie.

RECITAL II (16 candidates max. – 25 min.)

- 2 opera arias
- 2 Lieder or mélodies
- 1 or more arias or Lieder/mélodies from the Second Viennese School or composed after 1970 (5 to 10 minutes).

SEMI-FINAL (8 candidates max. – 40 to 50 min.)

- Programme of the candidate's own choice, which must be created around an artistic or themed project. The jury will look out for the originality and artistric cohrence in the programme. Any genre may be represented (opera, mélodie, operetta, musical, contempo rary repertoire, etc.).

FINAL (4 candidates max. – with orchestra)

- 1 opera aria chosen from a given list
- 1 Lied with orchestra chosen from a given list
- 1 piece of the candidate's own choice: opera, operetta or oratorio aria.

STRING QUARTET COMPETITION

INTRODUCTION

The String Quartet is a discipline particularly appreciated by the Genevan audience. After some thirty years of absence from the Geneva International Music Competition, 2001 saw its return and it now features every 5 years. A vital step for young quartets, the Geneva International Music Competition has crowned some of the most talented ensembles, including the Terpsycordes, Voce, Galatea, Hermès and Armida Quartets.

The especially demanding programme will ensure the selection of a very high quality ensemble, already well on their way to a professional career and sufficiently mature to confront the strong competition in this domain.

ENTRY CONDITIONS

The 71st Geneva International Music Competition is open to all quartet musicians, aged 35 and below, regardless of gender or nationality. The sum of the ages of the four quartet musicians must not exceed 120. There are no exceptions.

Candidates who have previously won a First Prize in the Geneva International Music Competition are not permitted to enter in the same discipline.

- 1 quartet of their own choice from the 20th century, including Debussy's Quartet.







PARNERSHIP WITH THE HAUTE ECOLE DE MUSIQUE (HEM GENEVA)

Professional Workshops

For several yeats now the Geneva international Music Competition has been participating in professional workshops organised by the Geneva HEM. The aim has been to provide students with the opportunity to meet confirmed professionals, begin a dialogue with them and gain a more precise idea of the realities of life as a professional musician. Within its area of expertise, the Competition can help future professionals to better understand the world of music competition, the way in which juries and their expectations function, and therefore prepare any musicians wanting to enter.

PARTNERSHIP WITH UNIVERSITY OF GENEVA

The Geneva Competition and the Department of Musicology have become partners with a flexible organisation of plants. At a class given during the autumn term at the Department of Musicology entitled «Music and Voice in the 20th Century», Professor Ulrich Mosch will guide students through the recent history of vocal music, intimately linked to the history of the voice; they will thus discover the enormous variety of ways it has been used in music. Ulrich Mosch will also take part in a public round table involving jury members and students on the topic of the challenges of «interpreting contemporary vocal music». Finally, the Student's Prize will give musicology students the chance to choose their favourite Voice competition finalist. The same students will post interviews with the participants and jury members on our website and social network review pages.

SUPPORT FOR WINNERS

Two Years of Agency Service

Winners of the Geneva International Music Competition benefit from two years of support from the ProMusica concert agency, giving them the chance to begin performing on stage internationally as well as in Switzerland. While this service can guarantee a series of bookings, it mainly represents promotional work for the winners after their victory.

Winners' Tour

In the eyes of both the public and professionals, a music competition's reputation and distinction can only be defined by the quality of its winners. The Geneva International Music Competition is therefore proud of the talented young people who come to defend their art and is delighted to support them on a tour that will take them to the most prestigious international music scenes.

Live Recordings

The Special Breguet Prize, awarded to one of the finalists, gives the winner the chance to record a portrait CD on the label Claves Records.

Initiated in 2003 in association with Montres Breguet, the Competition's main partner, the aim of this project is to offer young and promising artists a vital tool to launch an international career. Broadcast live every year on Espace 2, the finals are also recorded on a promotional CD.

And other tools for organizing the career...

Although the main objective is to allow prize-winners of the Geneva Compettion to familiarize themselves with the stage, these concerts are also a great opportunity to explore othe facets of being a musician. Thus, as of 2017, we hope to put into place different encounters and workshops with the professionals of the music world, addressing questions such as personal marketing, career management, musicians' health and administration.

LAUREATES TOURS

In 2003, thanks to the Friends Association of the Geneva Competition, we were able to initiate our first «laureates concert», which was held in Geneva during the Spring following the competition. After several local editions, the concert was exported to different cities, and was soon to become a European tour. Having developed well beyond the European borders, it now constitutes one of the most important means of promoting the Competition internationally.

The Laureates Tour is organized and produces by the Geneva Competition, in collaboration with local partners bases in the different cities and countries of the tour. This allows the Competition to present its prize-winner through original concert programmes, which consistently include contemporary music.

In 2017 and 2018, several tours are scheduled: a string quartet tour in Latin America, the United States and Europe, and a voice tour that will take place in Asia, following the 2017 Laureates Festival, which will be dedicated to voice and opera.
