Founded in 1939, the Concours de Genève is one of the world's leading international music competitions. Its mission is to discover, promote and support young talented artists, providing them with the necessary tools to launch an international career.

RENOWNED LAUREATES

The list of Concours de Genève prize-winners is a roll-call of many of the greatest musicians including Martha Argerich, Arturo Benedetti-Michelangeli, Victoria De Los Angeles, Alan Gilbert, Nelson Goerner, Friedrich Gulda, Heinz Holliger, Nobuko Imai, Quatuor Melos, Emmanuel Pahud, Maurizio Pollini, Georg Solti, José Van Dam, Christian Zacharias, Tabea Zimmermann – and many more.

MULTIDISCIPLINARY APPROACH

Within the world of international music competitions, a multi-disciplinary approach is rare and represents one of the Concours de Genève's most distinctive assets. Since its creation in 1939, 26 disciplines have been presented: instrumental, vocal, ensemble music or conducting. Today, the Competition alternates between eight main disciplines: piano, flute, clarinet, cello, viola, string quartet, voice and percussion. Every second year, it offers the Composition Competition.

SUPPORTING CONTEMPORARY CREATION

Every second year, Geneva hosts a Composition Competition, continuing the tradition of the Prix Reine Marie José. By placing musical creation at the heart of its artistic project, the Concours de Genève plays a pioneering role and contributes to the renewal of classical and contemporary music.

CAREER DEVELOPMENT

Concours de Genève laureates are offered an ambitious career development programme, providing precious support and advice to help boost their careers. This includes management representation, two years of international concert tours with one winner given the opportunity to record an album, with orchestra, on the La Dolce Volta label.

80TH ANNIVERSARY EDITION

This year, the Concours de Genève celebrates its 80th Anniversary edition with the Conducting Competition returning for the first time since 1994 when Alan Gilbert won the top prize.

CONDUCTING COMPETITION

A COMPETITION IN TWO STAGES

The return of Conducting to the Concours de Genève, more than thirty years after the 1994 edition, called for a dedicated format. Bringing together several orchestras, numerous musicians and substantial resources, the Competition was designed to take place over two seasons, in 2025 and 2026.

The first two rounds took place in autumn 2025 with the **Orchestre de la Haute école de musique de Genève**, followed by the **Orchestre de Chambre de Genève**, resulting in the selection of six semi-finalists.

In November 2026, they will continue the Competition through **three Semi-Final Rounds**, each featuring a different ensemble and repertoire: the **Orchestre de Chambre de Genève** in 19th-century symphonic repertoire, **Ensemble Contrechamps** in contemporary repertoire, and the **Orchestre de la Suisse Romande** in a programme of concertos with soloists.

Three candidates will then advance to the Finals with the **Orchestre de la Suisse Romande**. The first will bring them together with the finalists of the **Composition Competition**, whose works they will conduct, while the second will be devoted to major symphonic repertoire.

This format allows the candidates to be assessed **across a wide range of settings, musical styles and repertoire**, on a journey spanning from Beethoven and Schubert to contemporary creation.

WORKSHOPS & MASTERCLASSES

Between the first rounds in 2025 and the Semi-Finals in November 2026, the six semi-finalists of the Conducting Competition have benefited from a dedicated development programme, inspired by the support traditionally offered by the Concours de Genève to its laureates. Masterclasses, work on contemporary music, professional workshops and the development of a personal artistic project have punctuated their year.

In February, the six conductors took part in a **five-day masterclass with Daniele Gatti**, organised in partnership with the **Orchestre de la Suisse Romande**. This first stage gave them the unique opportunity to work closely with the Italian conductor and the orchestra, several months before their return to Geneva for the Semi-Finals.

In May, the Conducting semi-finalists met the three finalists of the **Composition Competition** to explore the works selected by the jury. Led by conductor **Pascal Rophé**, a specialist in contemporary repertoire, the session focused on analysing and approaching new scores, in preparation for the joint Composition and Conducting Final in November.

Finally, in September, the six semi-finalists return to Geneva for a **professional development workshop** addressing key aspects of a conducting career, including career development, working with agents, artistic identity and positioning within the music industry. They will also present their **Personal Artistic Project**, developed in

advance, to a jury of industry professionals. The selected project will receive the Fondation Etrillard Prize, awarded in November.

Together, these three initiatives extend the Competition beyond the competitive rounds themselves, providing the semi-finalists with artistic and professional support throughout the year as they prepare for the final stages of the Competition.

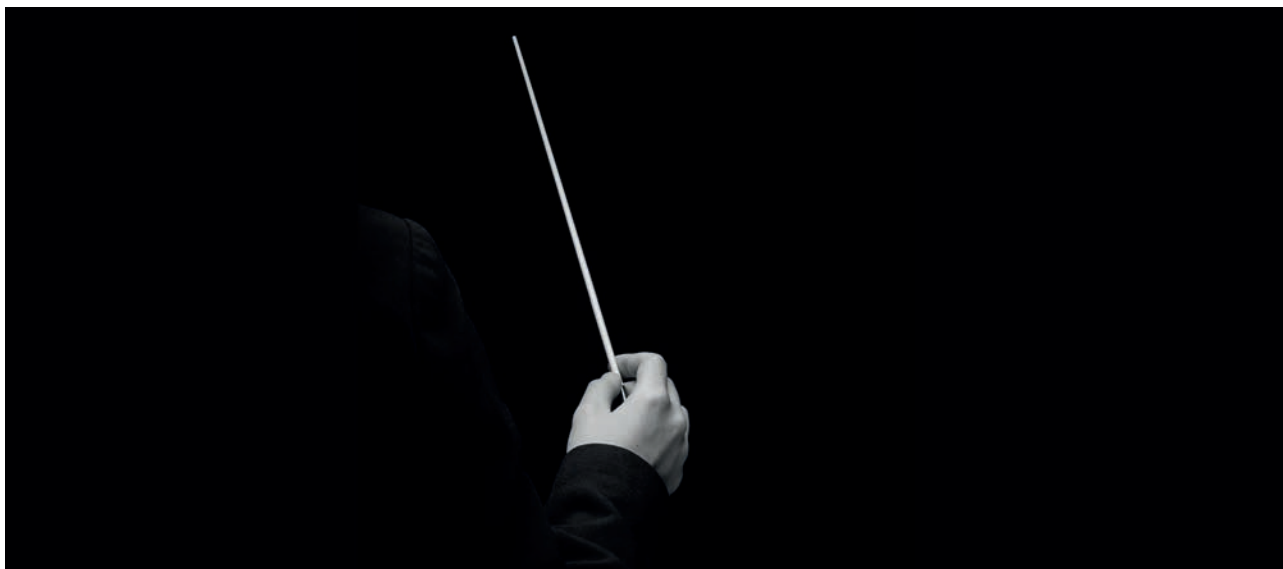

The official prizes of the Conducting Competition are generously funded by the Francis & Marie-France Minkoff Foundation

SPECIAL PRIZES

SEMI-FINALIST PRIZE CHF 3,000.-

This incentive prize is awarded to the three semifinalists of the Conducting Competition who were not selected to advance to the Final.

AUDIENCE PRIZE CHF 1,500.-

The Audience Prize is awarded by the spectators of the Final Rounds with orchestra. The finalist who receives the most ballots is the winner of this prize.

YOUNG AUDIENCE PRIZE CHF 1,000.-

The Young Audience Prize is awarded by a group of students from public and private schools in Geneva, who have previously received specific training. Their evaluation assesses the two Final Rounds with orchestra.

STUDENTS' PRIZE CHF 1000.-

The Students' Prize is awarded by a group of students from the Faculty of Music and the Department of Musicology of the University of Geneva, who evaluate both Finals. It is integrated in their official curriculum. The Students' Prize is offered by Ms. & Mr. Hervieu-Causse.

ROSE-MARIE HUGUENIN PRIZE CHF 10 000.-

This prize rewards all the 2026 Conducting Laureates with a grant to carry out a project of their choice. The grant is administered by the Concours de Genève.

OSR MUSICIANS' PRIZE

The prize is awarded by the musicians of the Orchestre de la Suisse Romande to a finalist of the Conducting Competition. It consists of a concert engagement during the two seasons following the award.

HEM ORCHESTRA MUSICIANS' PRIZE

This prize is awarded by the musicians of the HEM orchestra who took part in the first round of the competition in 2025. It consists of a commission to conduct the orchestra for a project during the 2027–2028 season.

FONDATION ETRILLARD PRIZE CHF 5000.-

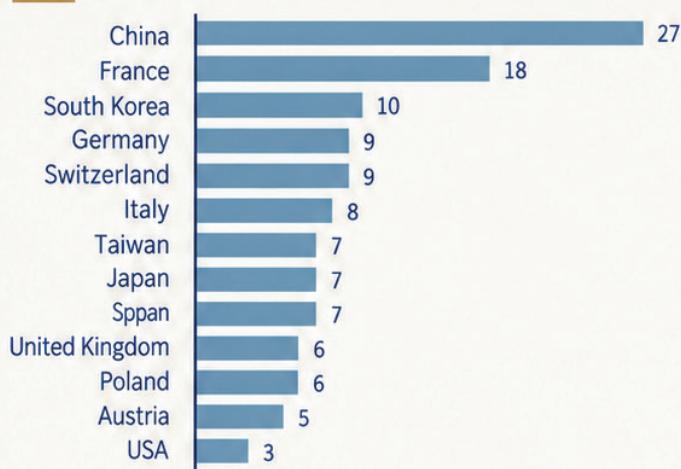
This prize is awarded by a special jury to the conducting finalist who presented the most outstanding artistic project during the professional workshop held in September 2026. The Foundation commits to supporting the realization of the winners' project in the years following the competition.

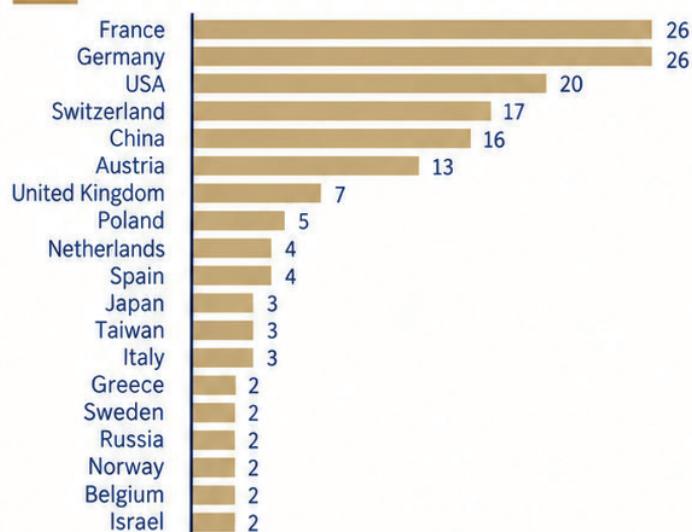

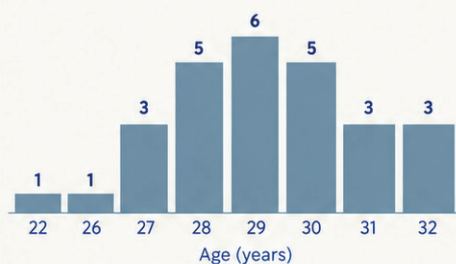

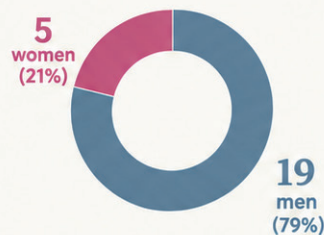

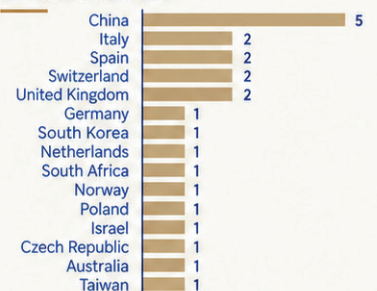
AGE OF SELECTED CANDIDATES

ALEJANDRO CANTALAPIEDRA, 33 YEARS OLD, SPAIN

Active across major European institutions, Alejandro Cantalapiedra served as Assistant Conductor of the Netherlands Philharmonic Orchestra and Dutch National Opera from 2023 to 2025, working closely with Lorenzo Viotti and leading guest conductors. He has collaborated with orchestras including the Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra and the Rotterdam Philharmonic Orchestra, and has conducted Sinfonia Varsovia, the Netherlands Chamber Orchestra, the Residentie Orkest, and the Orquesta Sinfónica del Principado de Asturias. JACOBUS DE JAGER, 30 YEARS OLD, SOUTH AFRICA

Recipient of the 2025–2026 Mills Williams Junior Fellowship in Conducting at the Royal Northern College of Music and a Royal Philharmonic Society Conducting Fellowship, conductor and pianist Jacobus de Jager is a graduate of the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland, where he studied with Martyn Brabbins and received the RCS Conducting Prize. He won the 5th South African Conductors' Competition and was twice a semi-finalist in the Herbert von Karajan Young Conductors Award. He has worked with orchestras across Europe and South Africa. She has recently been appointed Calleva Assistant Conductor of the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra for the 2026–2027 season. Since 2024, he has served as Music Director of the Orchestre et Choeur Symphonique du COGE in Paris and regularly collaborates with leading European ensembles.

The 2026 season marks a major milestone in Leonard Weiss's career, with debuts at the Deutsche Oper Berlin, the Munich Biennale, the Boston Symphony Orchestra, the Gewandhausorchester Leipzig, the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra, the Queensland Symphony Orchestra and Orchestra Victoria. In 2025, he was a Conducting Fellow at the Tanglewood Music Center and won the Khachaturian Competition as well as Third Prize at the Toscanini Competition. He served as Assistant Conductor of the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra in 2024 and 2025, following his appointment as Assistant Conductor in Residence in New Zealand in 2022. ANTOINE PECQUEUR

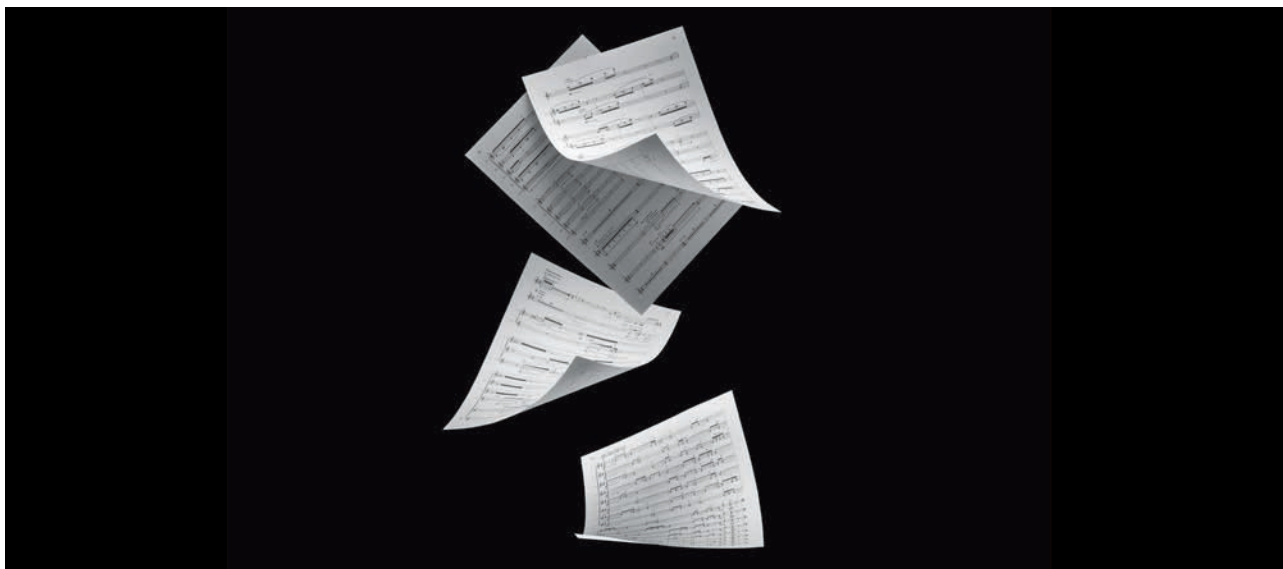

PRESENTATION

Every two years, the Concours de Genève presents its Composition Competition, continuing the legacy of the Queen Marie José Prize. Its purpose is to encourage the creation of new works and to support excellence in contemporary musical creation.

SUBJECT OF THE COMPETITION

The Composition Competition was open to candidates born after 11 November 1986. For the 2026 edition, candidates were invited to submit a work for symphony orchestra meeting the following requirements:

- **Duration:** from 12 to 16 minutes.
- **Date of composition:** the work must have been composed after March 2024. Revised/reworked versions of previously composed pieces are accepted.
- **Instrumentation:** the work must be written for symphony orchestra, without soloists and without the use of electronic systems.*

SELECTION ROUND

12-14 MARCH, RTS, GENEVA

188 applicants

A total of 188 candidates, aged 8 to 39 and representing 46 countries, registered for the competition. The Official Jury, chaired by Unsuk Chin, met in Geneva to review the submitted scores and selected three finalists:

The Composition and Conducting Competitions culminate in a joint Final. The three conducting finalists each conduct Beethoven's Egmont Overture, followed by one of the three finalist works from the Composition Competition, assigned by random draw. The works are performed by the Orchestre de la Suisse Romande.

The Final is followed by the Composition Awards Ceremony.

AUDIENCE PRIZE CHF 1,500.-

The Audience Prize is awarded by the spectators of the Final Rounds with orchestra. The finalist who receives the most ballots is the winner of this prize.

YOUNG AUDIENCE PRIZE CHF 1,000.-

The Young Audience Prize is awarded by a group of students from public and private schools in Geneva, who have previously received specific training. Their evaluation assesses the two Final Rounds.

STUDENTS' PRIZE CHF 1,000.-

The Students' Prize is awarded by a group of students from the Faculty of Music and the Department of Musicology of the University of Geneva, who evaluate both Finals. It is integrated in their official curriculum. The Students' Prize is offered by Ms. & Mr. Hervieu-Causse.

NICATI-DE LUZE PRIZE CHF 5,000.-

The Nicati-de Luze Prize consists of a commission for a work lasting between 7 and 10 minutes for a solo instrument or voice. The Nicati-de Luze Prize is awarded by the Competition Jury to the First Prize winner (or, failing that, to the Second Prize winner). The Nicati-de Luze Foundation will cover all or part of the production costs of the premiere and/or subsequent performances, up to a maximum of CHF 7,000..

BASEL SINFONIETTA PRIZE

The Basel Sinfonietta Prize is awarded by the representatives of the Basel Sinfonietta to a finalist of the Composition Competition at the end of the Final. It consists of the commitment to play a work of the winner within two seasons of obtaining the prize.

PRIMEURS MUSICALES PRIZE CHF 3,000.-

Awarded by representatives of the Primeurs Musicales Festival, this prize is presented to one of the finalists of the Composition Competition following the Final. It consists of a commission to compose a short work for string ensemble, which will be premiered at the Festival in autumn 2027.

UNSUK CHIN, CHAIR

Unsuk Chin was born in 1961 in Seoul and has lived in Germany since 1985. Her music is widely acclaimed around the world and has been celebrated with a series of prestigious international awards. She was composer in residence at the Lucerne Festival, the NDR Elbphilharmonie Orchestra, the BBC's Total Immersion Festival, and many more. She is also a dedicated concert curator and Artistic Director. Having directed the Seoul Philharmonic's Ars Nova and the London Philharmonia's Music of Today series, she is currently Artistic Director of the Tongyeong Festival in Korea and the Weiwuying International Music Festival in Taiwan.



TOSHIO HOSOKAWA

Born in Hiroshima, Toshio Hosokawa is one of the most significant Japanese composers of his time. He has written around 200 works, including orchestral works, concertos, chamber music and operas, and has been a member of the Berlin Academy of Arts since 2001. He has received the Japan Foundation Award (2018), the Goethe Medal (2021), the Berkeley Japan Prize (2023) and the BBVA Foundation Frontiers of Knowledge Award (2025). He is Artistic Director of the Takefu International Music Festival and the Suntory Hall Programme for Music Composition. His recent works focus on nature and often combine European and traditional Japanese instruments.



MAGNUS LINDBERG

Magnus Lindberg is one of the leading European composers of his generation, particularly admired for his orchestral music. His works are performed worldwide by major orchestras, ensembles and soloists, including Yefim Bronfman, Yuja Wang, Frank Peter Zimmermann, Pekka Kuusisto, Avanti, Ensemble InterContemporain, London Sinfonietta, Philharmonia Orchestra, and the Los Angeles and Chicago Symphony Orchestras, under conductors such as Salonen, Saraste, Oramo, Lintu, Franck, Rattle, Heras- Casado and Gilbert. He has been composer-in-residence with the New York Philharmonic, SWR Stuttgart and the London Philharmonic, and his music is widely recorded on Deutsche Grammophon, Sony, Ondine and Finlandia..



AUGUSTA READ THOMAS

Named "Chicagoan of the Year" by the Chicago Tribune in 2016, Augusta Read Thomas is one of today's most acclaimed and widely performed contemporary composers. Her music "embodies unbridled passion and fierce poetry" (American Academy of Arts and Letters), while The New Yorker has described her as "a true virtuoso composer." Former Mead Composer-in-Residence with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra – the longest-serving composer to hold the position – she founded and directs the Chicago Center for Contemporary Composition and the Grossman Ensemble. Among her many honours is the Ernst von Siemens Music Prize..

KATHARINA ROSENBERGER

Composer Katharina Rosenberger is Professor of Composition at the Haute école de musique de Genève and co-director of the SONIC MATTER Festival in Zurich. She regards the act of music-making as intertwined with its environment, inherently social and anti-hierarchical. Her work questions traditional ways of producing, performing, and experiencing music. Rosenberger has received numerous awards, including the 2023 Swiss Music Award, the 2019 Guggenheim Fellowship, and the Mediaprojects/Sitemapping Award from the Swiss Federal Office of Culture in Bern.

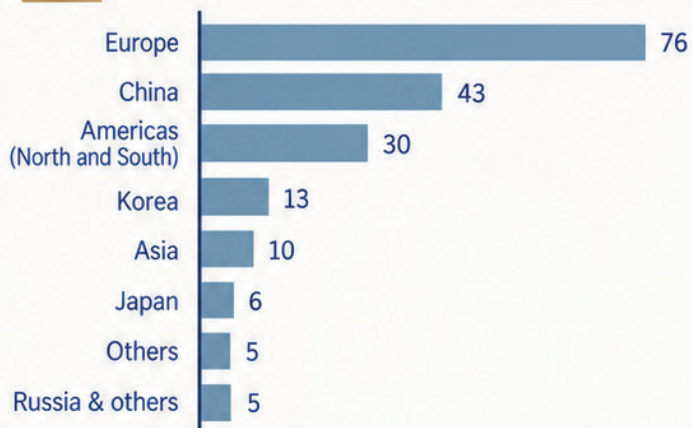


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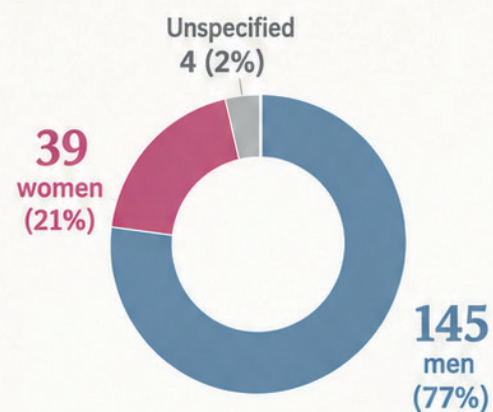

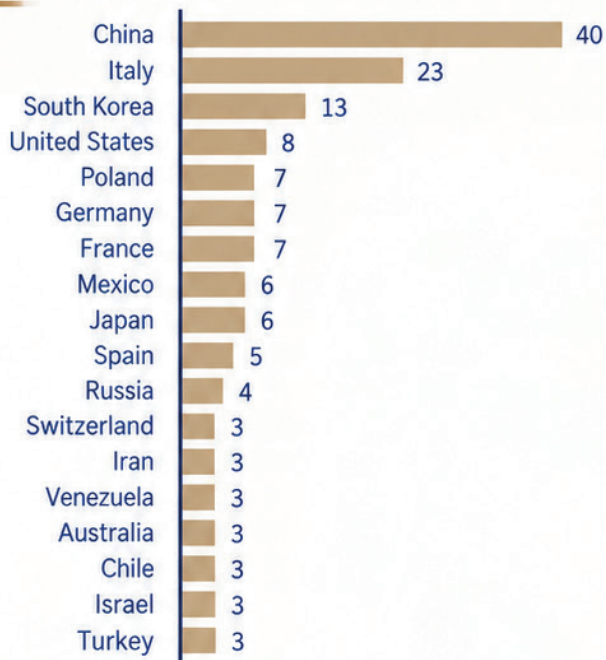
REGION OF ORIGIN

FINALISTS



SING-YAT CHEN, 26 YEARS OLD, HONG KONG

Sing-Yat Chen is a Hong Kong composer and pianist, and a 2026 Gaudeamus Award finalist. Described by Neue Musik Zeitung as displaying an “impressively reflective inner struggle,” she creates immersive soundscapes inspired by literature, science and the visual arts. A former Bang on a Can Fellow, she has collaborated with Ensemble Modern and cellist Jeffrey Zeigler. Her works, which explore themes of duality, have been presented at Festival Mixtur and performed on the historic 1746 Hildebrandt organ.

HER WORK

SHATTERED SKY / REMAINING LAND

“Inspired by James Turrell’s Skyspace, this work explores samsara through breath. Gazing at an aperture recalls a pale sun after a bleak winter—a punctured sky where light pierces with sharp agony. From a fragile bass clarinet monologue, the sound gradually fractures into noise, mirroring the crackling glaze of Song Dynasty Ru ware.”



HANURIJ LEE, 21 YEARS OLD, SOUTH KOREA

Born in Seoul, Hanurij Lee is currently studying composition at the Korea National University of Arts. His work explores the sonic relationships between instruments through their inherent possibilities and restrained gestures, rather than seeking to convey explicit concepts. His music has been performed at the Wittener Tage für Neue Kammermusik, the Verbier Festival, the Daegu International Contemporary Music Festival, and as part of the Initiative Neue Musik OWL.

HIS WORK

STUFF #1

“The Stuff series originates from an interest in the endlessly repetitive structures of Khrushchyovka apartments and the gradual erasure of individual sensation within them. However, Stuff #1 (Hymne pour le Velu qui hoche la tête) departs slightly from the dry and rigid atmosphere of the previous works, instead emerging from images of dust, fur, and a shaggy figure subtly nodding its head. Repetition remains central, but here it functions less as a structural device than as a kind of sensory residue accumulating inside an aging interior.”

RAFAEL MARINO ARCARO, 37 YEARS OLD, BRAZIL/ITALY

Rafael Marino Arcaro is a Brazilian composer now based between Berlin and London. His music draws on memories of his rural childhood – fruit trees, insects, nighttime creatures – as well as his reflections on Brazilian artistic identity. Known for an aesthetic of clarity and restraint, he writes works imbued with the flavours of sour mango and cotton candy. His music is emotionally direct, combining playful seriousness with, at times, striking violence.

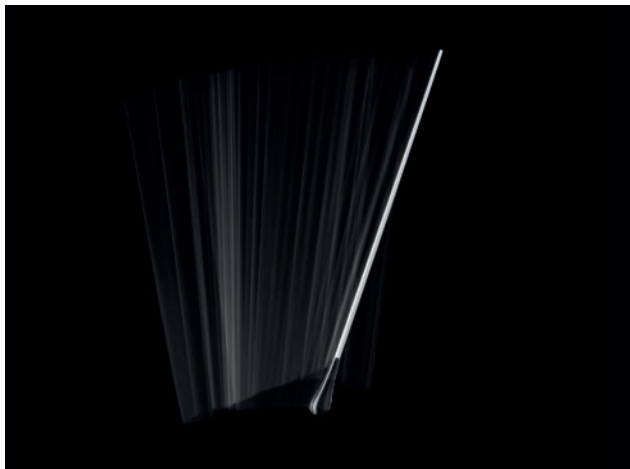

MEDIATION



A true cultural project, the Concours de Genève has brought together the city's main musical institutions for over 80 years. Outreach activities are an important part of the Competition, which seeks to transmit its values and introduce young people and local communities to classical music.

AUDIENCE PRIZE

The Audience Prize gives those attending the Finals the opportunity to express their own opinion by voting for their favorite finalist.

YOUNG AUDIENCE PRIZE

Today's youth forms tomorrow's audience. Participating in the Young Audience Prize teaches young people to become active listeners, but also how to form a judgement, how to review an artist's performance. This project brings together music students, but also students from local public and private schools.

STUDENTS' PRIZE

The Students' Prize brings together in the same jury music students from the Haute école de musique de Genève and musicology students from the University of Geneva. Future professionals of the music field, they will someday become performers, composers, music critics, scholars, presenters, and concert organizers...

MASTERCLASSES

For more than ten years, the Concours de Genève has organised, in collaboration with the Haute école de musique Genève-Neuchâtel, a masterclass led by one of the members of its juries. This year's masterclass is dedicated to piano students from the HEM Genève.

NEW AUDIENCES

The Concours de Genève has recently created an outreach policy directed towards remote, impeded, or distant audiences. By offering concerts in public spaces, in companies and in institutions, it aims at arousing curiosity, stimulating interest in classical music, and reaching new audiences.

MEDIATION



YOUNG AUDIENCE PRIZE

The Young Audience Prize reflects the Concours de Genève's commitment to cultural participation and to making classical music accessible to younger generations. Open to participants aged 12 to 25, the programme offers a unique immersion in the world of the Concours.

It welcomes young people from a wide range of backgrounds, whether they are pursuing musical studies or simply wish to discover classical music from a new perspective. Through workshops, meetings with music professionals and opportunities for discussion, participants develop listening skills and learn how to express thoughtful and informed artistic opinions. They then serve as a jury and award the Young Audience Award to the candidate of their choice, with the winner announced at the Awards Ceremony.

2026 PROGRAMME

- **Composition:** An immersion in the world of contemporary music creation, including a preparatory workshop, discussions with composers, access to the Final Round and a behind-the-scenes experience.
- **Conducting:** An opportunity to experience the art of conducting at close range, with a preparatory workshop, access to a Semi-final Round, a practical conducting workshop alongside professional musicians, followed by access to the Final Round and a behind-the-scenes experience.

COLLABORATION WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF GENEVA

Each year, the University of Geneva and the Haute école de musique de Genève jointly offer an introductory course in music mediation. Students from both institutions are invited to design mediation projects aimed at helping diverse audiences engage with musical works and instruments, reflect on the social and aesthetic dimensions of music, and gain insight into the profession of musician. These activities, which take place prior to the musical performance itself, can take a variety of forms, ranging from sound productions and programme notes to more interactive exchanges with audiences.

A partner of the course since its inception, the Concours de Genève offers students the opportunity to put their ideas into practice by connecting them with audiences and showcasing their work. This year, course participants will meet the composers competing for the Composition Competition, write texts about the works performed during the Finals, and develop a mediation activity for concertgoers on the evening of the concert.

PRIZEWINNERS

CAREER DEVELOPMENT

In 2003, the Concours de Genève launched its ambitious Career Development Programme. Consisting of various modules, the programme is designed to help our laureates explore and define their artistic identity while equipping them with the tools necessary for an international career.

I. CONCERTS & MANAGEMENT

In addition to the official prizes, laureates benefit from two years of support from the Paris-based concert agency Sartory Artists. The programme is structured around three key areas: **visibility**, through concerts, collaborations, professional encounters and connections with networks and agencies; **mentoring**, through training, shared experience and a deeper understanding of the profession, its codes and practical realities; and **exploration and development**, with personalised coaching designed to foster musical growth, strengthen artistic identity and support the development of new projects.

II. PRIZEWINNERS' WORKSHOP

Each year, the Concours de Genève organizes professional workshops, offering participants sessions on topics such as stage presence, health and well-being, career management, personal branding, and social media. This year, the six semi-finalists of the Conducting Competition took part in two workshops, one in May and one in September.

III. ARTISTIC PROJECT

To enable young musicians to express their artistic vision and pursue their professional ambitions, the Concours de Genève introduced the Artistic Project round, supported by the Fondation Etrillard. The most compelling project will receive the support of both the Competition and the Fondation to make it a reality.

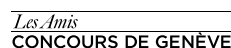
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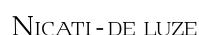
